Dear Friends and Supporters,

It has been a privilege to serve as chairman of the EduNations board for 2025. Your support remains critical to our mission of educating children from remote rural villages. The growth of our student, feeding, and teacher sponsorship programs has provided a reliable monthly revenue stream, enabling us to retain our highly dedicated and qualified teachers and to supply nutritious meals that help our students perform at their best. We are grateful that our students continue to receive national recognition in numerous forums.

During our February trip to Sierra Leone, I visited the family and friends of Yeabu and Mohamed, the two students from Rokassa whom Emily and I sponsor. The education these children are receiving is bringing a new ray of hope to their families and community—a hope that looks beyond the subsistence living they have known and points them toward a different future in the light of Christ, who offers spiritual hope for their lives beyond this world.

During our medical outreach trip in June, we were able to invite EduNations alumni—now pursuing nursing, community health, and medical degrees—to join us in addressing the physical and spiritual needs of their own communities. Seeing their eagerness to learn and to apply their knowledge to serve their families and neighbors was both inspiring and deeply rewarding. God's work in the lives of these young people in Sierra Leone is truly bearing fruit.

This past year has not been without unexpected challenges as we navigate a season of leadership transition in Sierra Leone. We are seeking God's guidance in selecting a new in-country director. At the same time, we are reorganizing some administrative structures to strengthen collaboration between our U.S. and Sierra Leone teams and to provide additional oversight and accountability. We are also encouraged by growing relationships with other faith-based ministries and are looking forward to enhancements to several of our existing programs.

Thank you again for your faithful support. We encourage you to invite your family, friends, and churches to partner with us in providing both quality education and the opportunity for children in Sierra Leone to hear the life-changing Good News of Jesus Christ. We also welcome your involvement through Village Gathering web events, in-person updates, and the opportunity to travel with us to witness firsthand how God is at work. 



EduNations provides free, high-quality education with trained teachers, student-centered learning, and essential resources such as textbooks, uniforms, and school supplies.

We are committed to educating the whole child in mind, body, soul, and spirit through four core pillars of development: **Intellectual development, physical development, psychological and social development, and spiritual development.**

Setting the Standard for Excellence in Education

Thanks to your generosity, EduNations is not only providing free, quality education in some of Sierra Leone's most under-resourced communities—we are delivering **excellence** that is turning heads nationwide. Because of your support, rural students who once had little hope of academic success are now outperforming their peers across the country.

In the 2024–2025 academic year, our students received results from their 2023-2024 external examinations

that far surpassed national averages. On the West African Senior School Certificate Examination (WASSCE) taken in Grade 12, the national pass rate in English was 19.7%. EduNations students achieved an outstanding 53% pass rate—nearly triple the national average. Even more impressively, our students have made up 40% of the top 10% in results across Sierra Leone—competing against students from government, private, and community schools nationwide.



Your investment is producing excellence across every level of education. Our students achieved a 76% pass rate in the Basic Education Certificate Examination (taken in Grade 9) and an 82% pass rate in the National Primary School Examination (taken in Grade 6)—both well above national performance. In Mathematics, our students averaged an incredible



89%, proving that they are mastering core subjects and building skills for a lifetime.

Our students' success in the classroom has also resulted in a deepened partnership with the government. The number of EduNations teachers who are "pin-coded"—receiving partial salary support directly from the government—rose by 30% this year, from 25 to 60. This recognition not only affirms the credibility of our schools but also strengthens our long-term sustainability.

And now, others are taking notice. This year, EduNations was honored with the Outstanding Educational Institution award, a rare recognition of excellence in our nation's schools. The government's Minister of Education himself served as keynote speaker at our graduation ceremony—publicly praising the quality of education we provide and expressing interest in our model.

This kind of achievement doesn't happen by chance. It's the result of your commitment, our dedicated teachers, and the resources you've helped provide—books, training, safe classrooms, and the belief that every child can succeed.

Together, we are breaking the cycle of educational disadvantage in rural Sierra Leone.





EduNations' boarding program offers students from remote areas safe, secure, and comfortable housing, three nutritious meals per day, and opportunities for personal growth through extracurricular activities.

Feeding the Future One Meal at a Time

At EduNations, we believe in caring for the whole child—body, mind, soul, and spirit. In the 2024–2025 school year, we furthered this commitment by completing a brand-new dining hall at

our Senior Secondary School campus. Finished on August 15, 2024, and formally opened on February 23, 2025, this bright, welcoming space now serves as the heart of our boarding program.

Before the dining hall was built, students ate in their dormitories. Now, all boarding students and staff members gather daily to share meals in one location. In addition to the large dining space, the building includes a spacious kitchen, storage rooms, an office, and restrooms. With furniture sourced through local vendors, the dining hall is designed for comfort and connection.

Our boarding students come from six different communities where EduNations has schools—Rokassa, Gbenekoro, Fintonia, Mayatta, Mapainda, and Makump. Because seating is unassigned, students can choose where to sit each day, encouraging friendships across community lines. This intentional approach strengthens relationships, builds unity, and fosters a sense of belonging that extends beyond the classroom.

Three nutritious meals are served daily—eggs, bread, and potato

Did You Know?

Boarding students in grades 10–12 have access to a variety of enriching activities outside the classroom designed to support personal, spiritual, and practical development:

Discipleship Groups – Weekly small-group Bible studies that help students grow in their faith, build community, and learn how to apply God's Word in everyday life.

Tailoring & Vocational Skills –

Hands-on training in sewing and basic vocational skills, equipping students with practical tools for future employment or entrepreneurship.

Sports & Recreation – Organized soccer, volleyball, and other games that promote teamwork, physical health, and stress relief after a full day of learning.

These programs round out the boarding experience and help shape students into well-rounded, capable young adults.

porridge for breakfast; rice with hearty sauces or beans for lunch; and dinners featuring spaghetti, cassava, or sandwiches. A vital contributor to the program's success is our partnership with **Rise Against Hunger**, which provides in-kind donations of fortified rice meal packets containing vitamins and dehydrated vegetables. These serve as the foundation for our rice bowls at lunch, improving nutrition while reducing operating costs so we can invest in other student needs.

For many, this access to three daily meals is life-changing. Adama A. Kamara, an SSS 2 Arts student, shared, “The meals help me stay strong and focus in class. I don't worry about going hungry anymore. I like how we eat together as a family—there's always laughter and stories.”

For Tejan P. Kamara, an SSS student, the benefits go beyond nutrition: “It helps me not to miss class because I don't go out looking for food. It also makes me feel cared for. No one is left out, and the place feels lively.”

The new dining hall has quickly become more than just a place to eat—it's a place where students are **nourished physically, encouraged socially, and reminded that they are valued**. It's another step in EduNations' ongoing mission to support the whole child, ensuring every student has the foundation they need to learn, grow, and thrive.

EduNations works in partnership with local communities and leaders to bring holistic transformation to communities through sustainable development projects and economic empowerment initiatives.

From Potholes to Possibilities

The road from Konta Line to Rokassa, where EduNations' nursery through senior secondary schools serve over 900 students, had become nearly impassable. Potholes, swampy sections, and damage from trucks and tractors made travel difficult, especially during the rainy season. Students struggled to get to school, buses often had to stop mid-route, and bicycles had to be carried by hand. Community members, food deliveries, and clinic staff also faced major challenges navigating the road.

Thanks to generous donor support, EduNations was able to work with a local contractor to repair the road, benefiting the entire community. The worst sections were addressed, culverts installed to improve drainage, and the road was restored to safe, passable condition.

The results were immediate. Buses can now transport students safely and efficiently, food and supplies reach the boarding school without delays, and local vehicles no longer get stuck. Principal Brima Kargbo notes, "Before the road was repaired, trucks often got stuck, but now vehicles move freely."

This road repair is more than infrastructure—it is a lifeline made possible by the compassion and support of generous donors just like you.



Cultivating Community Leaders

This year, 101 former EduNations students enrolled in university, marking a significant milestone for both our schools and the villages we serve.

Their achievement reflects not only personal determination but also the growing educational capacity within our partner communities. By supporting students as they advance to higher education, EduNations is helping to cultivate future leaders who will strengthen their families, contribute to village development, and inspire the next generation.

Powering Hope in Rokassa: Solar, Starlink, Water & Sanitation

Over the past year, the Sierra Leone Collective—EduNations, World Hope International, and Jericho Road Community Health Center—joined forces to launch a critical infrastructure project in the rural village of Rokassa. With over 1,000 people visiting the EduNations compound daily, the need for sustainable energy, internet access, clean water, and sanitation was urgent.

So far, the project has completed the first three phases of solar installation, providing reliable electricity to the school, medical clinic, and community hub. Starlink internet connectivity now allows staff to communicate efficiently, access online resources, and improve educational and healthcare delivery in real time.

While clean water systems and sanitation facilities have been upgraded to improve hygiene and reduce waterborne illnesses, additional boreholes still need to be drilled to

ensure an adequate and consistent supply of clean water for the entire community.

This project exemplifies the Collective’s vision: uniting expertise and resources to meet holistic needs. Together, we are not just building infrastructure—we are building a future filled with light, connection, health, and hope.

Building Healthy Habits Through WASH Clubs

In the 2024–2025 school year, EduNations launched WASH (Water,



Sanitation, and Hygiene) Clubs in all 15 of our schools to equip students with essential hygiene knowledge and habits. Meeting every Wednesday, these ongoing clubs—led by trained student ambassadors and supported by teachers—taught World Health Organization handwashing standards, personal and environmental cleanliness, and how to prevent diseases such as cholera and typhoid.

In rural areas where proper hygiene practices are often unfamiliar, these clubs are transforming student behavior and school environments. “The training taught me how to keep myself and others safe by washing hands properly, using clean toilets, and protecting our water sources,” shared Kadiatu Kamara, JSS 3, EduNations Hope Academy, Fintonia. “My favorite part of the WASH Club was learning how to be a hygiene ambassador.”

By empowering students as peer leaders, WASH Clubs are creating ripple effects of health and cleanliness throughout our communities.



EduNations provides basic and emergency medical care, along with health education, to support the physical well-being of students and their surrounding communities.

Serving with Open Hands

Jana Marshall, one of our dedicated supporters from Texas, began partnering with EduNations in 2024 after her first trip to Sierra Leone. In February 2025, she joined a medical missions team, where she witnessed firsthand the impact of bringing Christ-centered care to our villages. Here, she shares her experience:

God is full of surprises! This May and June, a team of students and staff from Campbell University's medical school in North Carolina, along with Dr. Jeff Gingrich and myself (a retired family physician from Texas), trekked to five of the six EduNations villages. We were amazed to see the Lord's hand at work in so many ways.

On our first clinic day, we were greeted by a large crowd waiting patiently. In fact, most days we evaluated and treated around 200 patients, many walking miles to receive care. The team saw a wide variety of ailments, from malaria to musculoskeletal issues. Each patient had something unique about his or her own story. Patients were grateful not only for the free treatment but also for prayer

offered in Jesus' name. Seeing each new smile felt like a blessing from God.

We worked closely with EduNations staff, local pastors, and health workers, building bridges with the communities for Christ. Children and adults alike received corrective eyeglasses, helping students succeed in the classroom. The Campbell team also brought soccer balls and a parachute, creating joyful moments with the children and reminding me of our Savior's special invitation to the little ones.

In Gbenekoro, we met teacher Daniel Kargbo, who was thankful for the new teachers' quarters. In Rokassa, I was reunited with my sponsored students, who were excited about their plans for graduation. We even met villagers who had survived snakebites thanks to quick action by EduNations staff—thanks be to God!

All of this made our Sunday worship with our Sierra Leonean brothers and sisters deeply meaningful. Seeing the Holy Spirit moving in the lives of these communities was nothing short of a miracle.

Welcoming Joy Sowa, Rokassa's First School Nurse

In 2025, EduNations welcomed a much-needed addition to our Rokassa schools—a dedicated school nurse. Joy Sowa, a certified Community Health Officer and missionary with Sierra Leone Fellowship of Evangelical Students, now serves the 900+ students in our four Rokassa schools, including our Senior Secondary boarding school.

Each day, Joy treats 20–25 students for common but potentially serious illnesses like malaria, respiratory infections, and injuries. By providing care on campus, she keeps students in class, prevents illnesses from worsening, and reduces unnecessary visits to the community health clinic run by our partners at Jericho Road.

Thanks to Joy's presence, more students in Rokassa are healthy, learning, and thriving.

EduNations advocates for children's and girls' rights, offers spiritual and emotional care through group and individual counseling, and educates the community on social issues to foster a safe and supportive environment.

Empowering Students Through Sex Education

As part of EduNations' psychosocial and social support program, we provide sex education classes to equip students with the knowledge and confidence to make wise decisions about their bodies, relationships, and futures. In our rural communities, young people face risks such as sexual abuse, early pregnancy, and harmful practices like FGM. By offering truthful, age-appropriate information, we help them stay safe and focused on their education.

Although not part of the national curriculum, these sessions are structured extracurricular activities led by school social workers. In 2024–2025, sessions were held once

per term for students from Primary 3 through SSS 3 (ages 8+), reaching 2,116 students. Topics included puberty, personal hygiene, consent, STDs, abuse prevention, peer pressure, and healthy relationships. Sensitive subjects were discussed in separate gender groups, while foundational topics were taught in mixed settings.

The impact has been transformative—students show greater self-respect, speak up against abuse, and make more informed choices.

Saving the Teachers: A Year of Growth in Teacher Sponsorship

This past year marked a significant step forward for EduNations as we launched and grew our “Save the Teachers” campaign—an urgent response to a critical need: ensuring that our teachers in Sierra Leone are paid on time and in full.

In many rural parts of the country, teachers often go months without pay, or receive wages that are far below the cost of living. Yet they continue to serve faithfully, providing life-changing education and Christ-centered mentorship to students in the most under-resourced communities. Recognizing their sacrifice and essential role, we set out to change the story.

Through the generosity of individuals, churches, and mission partners, EduNations has seen encouraging momentum in the past year. Dozens of teachers are now sponsored by donors who have committed to supporting their full annual salaries. In addition to financial support, sponsors are invited to pray for their teachers, write words of encouragement, and build meaningful relationships with these front-line educators.

Thanks to this growing support, teachers have reported feeling more valued, more secure, and more motivated than ever. Reliable pay allows them to provide for their families, focus more fully on their

students, and stay committed long-term—greatly improving the quality and consistency of education across our network of schools.

The success of this campaign laid the groundwork for our 2025 initiative, “25 Teachers in 2025,” which aimed to bring even more teachers into the sponsorship program. As we look ahead, we celebrate the foundation that was built this year—one that honors the calling and contribution of every EduNations teacher.

Because when we invest in teachers, we invest in the future of every student they serve.

Feeding Hope: Eden Christian Academy Students Take Action

This spring, 52 juniors at Eden Christian Academy put their leadership lessons into action through a service project called **Meals for Mariatu**. As part of their 11th grade Bible class, “Leadership Studies,” taught by Mr. Michael Hall, students launched 11 creative fundraisers to help feed students at EduNations’ Senior Secondary School in Sierra Leone.

Each small group of students was challenged to raise \$330—enough to feed five students for a month. Projects included everything from “Donut Depot” and “Frozen Fridays” to raffles, pancake breakfasts, and a student-run film festival. Altogether, the class raised an astounding \$6,082.78, providing over a month of meals for 92 students—exceeding their goal by more than 60%.




