A Day In The Life of Our Students



Most days in the program are not built around big events or special moments. They are built around steady rhythms that help children grow. Some students arrive by walking over the dirt trails that connect their homes to the campus, surrounded by the tropical green of the community. Others arrive by bus from the Patrice community, coming together for another day of learning, meals, friendship, and care.

At the end of the day, the children begin making their way home. Some walk in groups, and many of the younger children are accompanied by their older siblings. Once they arrive home, the day is not finished yet. Most students still have homework to complete for the next morning. These ordinary routines may not always feel dramatic, but they are part of the steady growth we get to see happening every week.

When a Letter Arrives

There is something special about the moment a student receives a message from their sponsor. When a note comes through the REACH app, it is translated into Portuguese so the child can understand it clearly.

The children are always excited to hear from their sponsors. Even a simple message of encouragement can mean a lot. It reminds them that someone is thinking about them, praying for them, and cheering them on as they continue to learn and grow.

Learning to Lead by Serving

Leadership development often begins in very simple ways. For the students, responsibility is not only something they hear about in class. It is something they practice through small, daily habits. After meals, the children clean their plates. Around the classrooms, students help clean chalkboard erasers and assist with keeping the campus clean.

We also see older students naturally helping younger ones throughout the day. Sometimes this looks like walking a younger sibling home. Sometimes it looks like helping a smaller child understand where to go, how to participate, or how to follow instructions. These small acts of service build confidence and remind our students that leadership is not about position first. It is about serving others well.

Many of our older students have also been participating in Serve Saturday events, where our church and school communities come together for practical community outreach projects. Through these opportunities, students are learning that service is not limited to the classroom or campus. It is part of how we love our neighbors, care for our communities, and grow into leaders who are willing to help.



Academic Growth

In the primary grades, students are learning the basics of writing, reading, and math, while also growing through languages, strategic thinking, and creative arts. As they get older, their studies expand to include subjects such as Portuguese, math, biology, physics, English, French, computer technology, and other core classes.

We honor the Mozambican culture and context by using the local curriculum, while also strengthening the learning environment through smaller class sizes and higher accountability standards for the teaching staff. Throughout the week, students participate in Bible classes, and once a month they gather for chapel led by our church staff. These moments help students grow academically while also deepening their understanding of God's Word and their relationship with Him.
